2006 TEAM SELECTION NOTICE

1 EVENTS

This notice refers to selection of British teams to compete at the following International 420 Class Championships:

World & Ladies' World Championships; 26 July- 6 August 2005, at Gran Canaria. Junior European Championship; 11-19 August 2005, at Tavira, Portugal.

2 SELECTION PROCESS

Selection will be based strictly on performance at the 2006 Selection Series as described in the Notice of Race. Independent selectors appointed by the British International 420 Class Association will oversee the process.

There will be no appeals against the decisions of the selection committee.

By entering the Selection Series competitors are bound by the terms of this Team Selection Notice.

3 ELIGIBILITY

To be eligible for any British team, helm and crew shall fulfil the following criteria:

- Hold or be entitled to hold a United Kingdom Passport
- Be a member of the British International 420 Class Association.
- Enter the full Selection Series before the first race sailed.

4 DEFINITIONS

A male/mixed boat is a boat crewed by two males or a male and a female.

A female boat is a boat crewed by two females.

A youth boat is any boat in which both helm and crew are born in 1988 or later.

A maximum of seven boats will be selected for each event, being the maximum allocation of places for each country in accordance with the Class guidelines.

5 WORLD & LADIES' WORLD CHAMPIONSHIP

The first seven male/mixed boats will be invited to attend the World Championship.

The first seven female boats will be invited to attend the Ladies' World Championship.

If any of the boats decline its place, the next eligible boat (male/mixed or female as appropriate) will be invited until all places are filled.

6 JUNIOR EUROPEAN CHAMPIONSHIP

The first two male/mixed youth boats and the first two female youth boats will be invited to attend.

If any of the youth boats declines its place, the next eligible youth boat (male/mixed or female as appropriate) will be invited until the two male and two female places are filled.

The next three places will be offered to the highest ranking youth boats that have not already been offered a place in the Junior European Championship, and have not accepted a place in either the World Championship or the Ladies' World Championship.

If any of these boats declines its place, the next eligible youth boat that has not accepted a place in the World or Ladies' World Championship, will be invited, until all places are filled.
