FINAL NOTICE OF RACE

1 THE EVENT

The 2005 International 420 Junior European Championship, will be held at *Riva del Garda* in *ITALY* from the 11th to the 19th August 2005.

The races will be sailed in the waters of north Garda Lake. (See appendix A)

2. ORGANISING COMMITTEE

The championship is organised by **FRAGLIA VELA RIVA**, the **Italian Sailing Federation** and the **Italian 420** class association, in conjunction with the International **420** Class Association.

3 RULES

The event will be governed by:

- The "Rules" as defined in the ISAF Racing Rules of Sailing
- ♦ The ISAF Equipment Racing Rules of Sailing
- ♦ The Measurement Instructions

If there is a conflict between languages the English text will take in precedence.

4. ADVERTISING AND BOW NUMBER

The Junior European Championship is classified category **C**, according to the **ISAF** Regulation 20-Advertising Code.

Boats may be required to display on each side of the hull:

- ♦ A bow number (See Class rules C.3).
- Advertising of the event sponsor.

5. EVENTS FORMAT

The Junior European Championship shall be competed with:

- Qualifying series to divide the fleet into two fleets (Gold and Silver)
- Final series in two separate fleets (Gold and Silver).

7. ELIGIBILITY

The championship is only open to International 420 dinghies.

The **ISAF** competitors eligibility code (**ISAF Regulation 19**) shall apply. Each competitor shall be a member of his National Class Association and, if relevant, of his National Authority. Each competitor shall be entered by his National **420** Class Association or by his Federation/National authority if such an Association does not exist

The International 420 Class Junior European Championship is open to male, mixed or ladies crews from all nations.

Each competitor shall be born in 1987 or after.

8. ENTRIES AND RESTRICTIONS

Entries for Junior European Championship will be limited as in the International **420** Class Association Guidelines: **7** boats for each country and **14** boats for the host country in each championship.

Each entitled crew will be authorized to defend his title in addition to the crews defined above for each Country only if the age of the crewmembers is in accordance with the age rule below.

ALL BANK TRANSFERS SHOULD BE CLEARLY ANNOTATED WITH THE NAME OF THE COUNTRY AND THE SAIL NUMBERS AND/OR NAMES OF THE COMPETITORS.

Each entry and fee not received by the 11th July 2005 may not be accepted and shall be subject to a supplementary fee of €50,00.

10. DISCLAIMER

Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk. See rule 4, Decision to race.

The organizing authority will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the regatta.

11. MEASUREMENT

All boats shall be measured before racing in the days mentioned on this notice of race.

Each boat shall have a valid Measurement Certificate which must be produced at registration.

Random checks may be made at any time during the championships.

12. SAILING INSTRUCTIONS and MEASUREMENT INSTRUCTIONS

The sailing instructions will be available at the race office for each competitor and Team Leader after the country's final registration has been completed. The measurement instructions will be available for each competitor and Team Leader at the race office at registrations.

13. LADIES CREWS IDENTIFICATION

Each ladies crew shall have a square 25 cm red diamond mark on the top of the head of the main sail for identification.

14. SAFETY REGULATIONS

Competitors shall wear a life-jacket or other adequate personal buoyancy at all time when afloat (See Class rules C.4).

Wet suits and dry suits do not constitute adequate personal buoyancy

15. DRUG TESTING

Competitors are required to comply with the RRS 5 and ISAF Regulation 21 which bans the use of drugs.

Drugs testing may take place during the event.

16. COURSES

The format of the course will be a trapezoid. (see appendix E)

The target time of a race shall be around 60 minutes.

17. JURY, PROTESTS and PENALTIES FOR BREAKING RULES OF PART 2

An International Jury shall be appointed, according to **RRS** Appendix **N**, and his decisions shall be final and not subject to appeal (**RRS 70.4**).

18. SCORING:

The low point scoring system of Appendix A shall apply (RRS Appendix A).

Qualifying series:

- a. There will be 6 Qualifying series races with one discard.
- b. The Qualifying series results shall be converted to race score. These races scores shall be treated in all aspects as a race score for the final series (Race Q).
- c. The result of each round in the Qualifying series will be valid when all the boats complete this round.
- Final series: There will be 11 races plus the Qualifying series result (total 12 scores in the Results.)
- a. Two (2) final series (3 results in the final series including the race Q), are required to be completed to constitute a final series.
- b. When 3 races have been completed in the final series, all races in both the Qualifying and final series count towards a boat's score, excluding that boat's worst score.
- c. When 4 to 7 final series races have been completed (5-8, including Race Q) a boat's score shall be the total of her race score in the final series excluding her worst score.
- **d.** When **8** or more final series have been completed (**9-12**,including Race Q) a boat's score shall be the total of her race score in the final series excluding her two worst scores.

No more than three races can be competed each day.

19. PRIZES

The first three crews in Gold and Silver fleets ranking lists shall be given a trophy.

The first **three** European men or mixed crews and the first **three** European Ladies crews in Junior European championship shall receive a **GOLD**, **SILVER** and **BRONZE** medal.

At least, the first 20% of crews in the Gold ranking list shall be given a souvenir of the event.

The prizes are given to both member of a crew.

20. TITLES

Non European countries can compete but the titles shall be awarded only to European crews.

A Ladies crew ranking list shall be extracted from the general results in Gold and Silver fleets.

The title of International **420** Class Men Junior European Champion will be awarded to the first male or mixed European team in the **Gold** fleet ranking list of the Junior European Championship. If there is no European men/mixed team in the **Gold** fleet, the title of International **420** Class Men Junior European Champion will be awarded to the first male or mixed European team in the **Silver** fleet ranking list of the Junior European Championship.

The title of International **420** Class Ladies Junior European Champion will be awarded to the **first** Ladies European team in the **Gold** fleet ranking list of the Junior European Championship. If there is no European Ladies team in the **Gold** fleet, the title of International **420** Class Ladies Junior European Champion will be awarded to the **first** Ladies European team in the **Silver** fleet ranking list of the Junior European Championship.

21. ANTHEM

For the prize giving ceremony, each team leader is required bring his national anthem (short version) on compact disc (CD).

22. NATIONAL FLAG

Each coach boat of a national team shall fly a 20 x 30 cm white flag with the national letters (according to ISAF RRS) of her country.

23. INSURANCE

Each competitor shall produce on registration, an evidence of valid third party insurance with a minimum cover of **1.036.000 EURO** or the equivalent in other currencies.

Each participant warrants the suitability of his or her boat for the event.

24. COACHES

Mechanically propelled boats are generally prohibited to sail on Lake Garda, however, during this Event, a special permit to use such boats may be issued by the Organising Authority. The coaches or supporting personnel having a boat, shall bring the documents listed here below:

- Motor registration document;
- Insurance of the boat;
- · Driver's identity document

Each support boat shall fly a specific flag which will be supplied the Organising Authority together with the navigation permit.

No other individual team supports boats shall be used.

25. RIGHTS TO USE NAMES & LIKENESSES

Competitors automatically grant to the organizing authority without payment the right in perpetuity to make, use and show any motion picture, still picture and live, taped or filmed television of or relating to the event.

2. Weather information: Summer weather conditions

Thanks to the lake Riva del Garda benefits from a Mediterranean climate. In August temperature can reach 30°/33° degrees during the day.

Wind / Racing:

Garda is well known for being a "windsurfing" mecca, largely due to the thermally generated "Ora" wind that kicks in from the south usually around 12-1pm, and builds regularly up to a F4 and occasionally up to a F6-F7. This places an emphasis on strong boat handling as well as speed in these conditions. Conventional theory is that "there's more breeze nearer the cliffs" but that only holds true some of the time and also depends on the racing area you use. Occasionally you get thunderstorms rolling around the mountains and the clouds and drop in temperature can prevent the "Ora" from kicking in and if the light northerly or "Peler" is in place racing does sometimes take place in the 'wrong direction' which emphasises a range of different skill sets. The club has been in existence for some 80 years or so, and has a deserved reputation for hosting events to a World Championship level including the Match Race Worlds in 2003. You can be sure that the race management will be spot on and the support staff are used to dealing with foreign competitors

6. General Information

Location: Fraglia della Vela is situated in Riva Del Garda, located in Riva, which is in the North West corner of Lake Garda in Northern Italy. The town of Riva is particularly attractive and has a wide range of shops, bars and interesting restaurants. For non-sailing friends there's a lot to do on holiday including mountain biking, windsurfing hill climbing, canyoning, beach activities (pebbly), canoeing etc. The majority of which are all available within a short walk of the town centre. One of the features of this end of the lake (in Trentino) is that no motorboats are allowed (other than ferries or rescue boats) which helps to keep the noise levels down and the dreaded jet-skiers out of the picture. So if you have friends or relatives interested in "sharing" your holiday – bring them along.

Getting There

Airports to head for are either Verona, Brescia or Bergamo, all of which can be reached by a number of cheap airlines e.g. Ryan air or FlyBe.

The nearest Airport to Riva d/G is the Verona Catullo one, that is 60 Km far away from Riva.

On arrival at the airport of Verona the next issue is transport to / from Riva.

Options include:

Taking direct buses Verona - Riva d/G (for more info see www.aptv.it).

Taking the railway Verona - Rovereto. From Rovereto to Riva there is not railway service but buses connect the two towns nearly every hour (for more info see www.ttspa.it)

Taking a taxi. For more info about taxes see the above point taxi service.

Hiring car for the week (for more info see www.avisautonoleggio.it). If driving from the Airport then follow the A4 east to the A22 North signposted Brennero, and exit at the Rovereto Sud exit (toll fee payable). Follow signs to Torbole and then Riva. After the tunnel from Torbole you will enter Riva itself, continue on the main road until you get to a roundabout, turn left here and the sailing club

If flying to Milano, please take note that particularly the Milano Malpensa Airport is 250 Km far away from Riva del Garda. The Milano Linate Airport is a bit nearer but is always much better to choose flying to Verona.

Driving

• Switzerland – Aim for Basle and then head south through Switzerland through the St. Gotthard Tunnel (scary!). Drop down to Milan and pick up the A4 heading east signposted Verona or Venice. Go along past the bottom of the lake and pick up the A22 North signposted Brennero, and exit at the Rovereto Sud exit (toll fee payable). Follow signs to

Torbole and then Riva. After the tunnel from Torbole you will enter Riva itself, continue on the main road until you get to a roundabout, turn left here and the sailing club is at the end of this road.

• Austria – Head into Germany and go south aiming for Munich. Follow the A8 to Salzburg, but turn off onto the A93 (South) which becomes the A12, following signs to Innsbruck. *Carnets / Tolls / Fines* Travelling through France and Italy you will have to pay road tolls on the Motorways, with barriers every now and again. In Switzerland / Austria its slightly different, as you stop at the border and buy a 'carnet' that covers you to drive on the motorways. This is around €40 in Switzerland to cover both car and trailer

On Arrival On arrival at Riva del Garda, park the boat in any spot you like, but make sure it's facing the lake so that when you rig up in the Ora you boat doesn't fly away. Also note that the club must keep the main road through the dinghy park clear as it's the coastal path.

Club Amenities The club amenities are very good with a nice bar and lounge area. There's an upper level sundeck and a smaller one for a post race beer in front of the club. Water, coffee and rolls are all available from the bar in the morning, and usually after racing there's free pasta for all competitors – to refuel after a blast.




